Movie review- Interstellar

Interstellar is not merely a movie; it is a journey through space, time, relativity, black holes and wormholes, while also exploring the enduring bond between a parent and child.

Directed by Christopher Nolan, the film follows Cooper, a former NASA pilot who becomes a farmer as Earth faces environmental collapse. When mysterious gravitational anomalies lead him to a secret NASA mission, Cooper joins a journey through a wormhole to search for a new home for humanity.

A remarkable example of how cinema can turn complex ideas into meaningful learning.

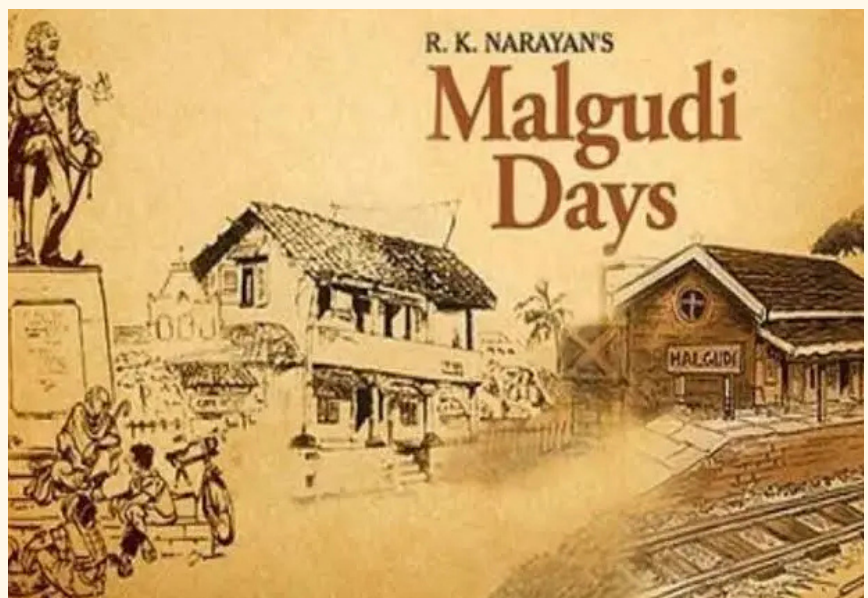
Book Review- Malgudi Days

What makes ordinary life worth reading about? R.K. Narayan's Malgudi Days offers a simple answer: every life has a story.

Set in the fictional South Indian town of Malgudi, this collection of short stories brings together schoolchildren, teachers, shopkeepers, doctors, farmers, artists and many others. Though their lives may appear ordinary, Narayan reveals their dreams, fears, struggles and small moments of joy with warmth and gentle humour.

Stories such as "An Astrologer's Day" explore ideas of fate, intelligence and forgiveness, often ending with an unexpected turn. Across the collection, Narayan touches upon kindness, social inequality, innocence, relationships and changing social values without losing sight of the human experiences at their heart.

Malgudi itself is central to the book. Its streets, shops, schools, temples and markets create a



recognisable small-town India, making the fictional town feel remarkably alive. In many ways, Malgudi becomes a character of its own.

The book's greatest strength is its ability to make us pause and notice the extraordinary within the everyday. It reminds us that literature need not always travel far to find meaningful stories.

Sometimes, the most compelling stories are already around us.
